

**Town of Holderness
Traffic Control Officers Ordinance**

Pursuant to the authority of RSA 41:11 and RSA 47:17, the Holderness Select Board hereby adopts the following ordinance regarding the use of traffic control officers:


Section I. Prior to commencing construction of a roadway, repair of a roadway, or construction or repair of items adjacent to a roadway where such construction or repair may interfere with traffic, it will be the responsibility of the contractor, utility company, or private person to contact the Chief of Police regarding the use of traffic control officers for the job site.


After review of the job site and consideration of the road size and type, traffic volume, and expected weather conditions, the Chief of Police will determine for public safety and convenience the number of traffic control officers needed and whether such officers may be qualified traffic control officers (supplied by the contractor, utility company, or private person) or will be uniformed police officers (paid for by the contractor, utility company, or private person). At all times on the job site, traffic control officers will be identified by wearing a safety vest.


This Ordinance does not apply to work that is being done by the Town of Holderness Highway Department or the State of New Hampshire.

Section II. If any provision of Section I is violated, the Chief of Police may issue a cease and desist order that will remain in effect until there is strict compliance with this Ordinance. In addition, a fine in the amount not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500) per day may be assessed for each day that a violation continues.


This Town of Holderness Traffic Control Officers Ordinance is accepted and enacted by the Holderness Select Board on June 6, 2022.
