Holderness Transfer Station Reconstruction to Begin October 4th

Temporary Transfer Station to be Located at DPW Facility.

Holderness Select Board Chairman Peter Webster announced this week the plans for the construction phase of the improvements to the town's transfer station. Conneston Construction, Inc. of Laconia has been awarded the design-build contract for just under \$300,000.00. Chairman Webster stated, "We are pleased to be working with a local firm like CCI who has worked successfully with the town in the past on building projects both at the Holderness Central School and the town hall. We are asking transfer station users to bear with us and make some adjustments to their regular disposal routine during the construction at the facility which includes a brief closure of the facility from October 4th through October 17th. During the project we will not only be making significant and long over due improvements to the physical facility, but we will also reopen the facility with a new method of handling most recyclable materials known as the single stream process. We anticipate the change to single stream will not only greatly improve the ease of recycling for our users but should also increase the volume of recyclables resulting in saving tax dollars!"

Temporary disposal accommodations for household trash and household recyclables only will be at the DPW facility located on Beede Road on the following dates; Saturday October 9th and 16th and Sunday October 10th and 17th and Monday October 11th from 8:00AM to 4:00PM each day. The temporary Beede Road location will not be accepting construction and/or demolition debris, bulky scrap metals, appliances, etc. Users are requested to hold on to these items and any other non-household recyclables until the new facility is completed and fully operational in late November.

Single Stream Recycling is Coming to Holderness Transfer Station!

In the very near future, with the construction of the redesigned transfer station, we are changing the way we collect our recyclables that will make the process easier for our users! Basically all recyclables, with few exceptions, which are listed in the back of this notice, will be discarded into one container! No more separating at home or at the transfer station just store at home in one container and empty it into one container! It's that easy! **Appendix A
Acceptable Recyclable Materials**

Acceptable Recyclable Materials, delivered all mixed together, shall include:

1. Fiber/Paper Products –“Anything That Rips”

- a. Newspaper, including all inserts
- b. Cardboard/boxes – all types, including cereal boxes and shoe boxes
- c. Magazines
- d. Catalogs
- e. Office paper
- f. Mail, including window envelopes
- g. File folders
- h. Shopping bags
- i. All books, including phone books
- j. Aseptic milk and juice cartons

2. Plastic, Metal and Glass including Containers

- a. All plastics labeled #1 through #7
- b. Empty bottles – all plastics, any color glass
- c. Empty cans (steel/bi-metal/or aluminum) including empty food containers
- d. Empty aerosol cans
- e. Aluminum foil
- f. Toys, rigid plastics

ITEMS NOT INCLUDED

Hazardous wastes: paints, stains and thinners; fuels and oils; antifreeze; fertilizers, pesticides and other chemicals; and other hazardous materials.

Universal wastes: fluorescent bulbs and lights, thermostats and any other item potentially containing mercury, computers, calculators, telephones, televisions and any item containing batteries of any kind.

Solid Waste: trash, food, food bags including potato chip bags, diapers, and all other solid waste

Styrofoam, including packaging materials, meat trays, and all Styrofoam board and peanuts.

Sharps - objects/ hypodermic needles

Other excluded materials: vinyl siding, CD/DVD's, garden hoses, tarps, bubble wrap
