Call to Order: L. Spencer called the meeting to order at 4:01 P.M.

OLD ITEMS:

- 1. Bench on Howe Town Forest Property
 - a. The bench has not yet been placed; may wait until the spring to place it or slide it out on a few sleds

NEW ITEMS:

- 1. Discussion with Bill Bolton of the Pemi River Local Advisory Committee (LAC)
 - a. Discussion centered on
 - i. What the group does (made up of members from 6 towns origin of Pemi to Franklin Dam – has 13 members; Lisa Donor from Plymouth talks about the Baker River; the group does sampling; development within ¼ mi of each side of the river; DES permitting re: Pemi River; works with Lakes Region Planning Commission; Plymouth well water quality; Tenney Mtn. Highway development along the Baker River; DES rules changes; look at legislation and what municipalities are doing).
 - ii. Questions from CC is there a report of river samplings? (no, but offered that the river has a low pH); has there been any conversation about Baker River protection? (no, any bills on the protection have failed); is there enough support to be an LAC? (yes, there seems to be plenty of support)
 - iii. The LAC needs to give us an invoice so that the CC can contribute to their budget to do their work
- 2. Discussion of the meeting at PSU dealing with PFAs

- a. Three people presented (talked about chemicals in PFAs/PFOs; where the chemicals are found in NH; how diseases spread; health studies/community awareness)
- 3. Meeting at the Holderness Free Library to discuss possible participation in Earth Day
 - a. L. Spencer is going to the meeting
 - b. Ideas for Earth Day offer guided walk with Education Director from SLA at the Town Forest; trail work on Howe Forest, learn to chain saw class
- 4. Discussion of the NRIs on Town Forest and Pilote Forest
 - a. L. Spencer shared concerns and highlights of the reports
 - b. Other members shared their comments
- 5. Spring Schedule
 - a. A. Packard will chair the May and June meetings

 - c. L. Spencer talked about the 675 yd firing range at the Pemi Fish & Game (that distance has been there for some time) and the 1000 yd range (W. Laverack shared that most is grandfathered and they have limited expansion capabilities); they have taken care of the issue related to lead from the guns
